

The facility seamlessly integrates long-term care, and acute care beds, emergency care, diagnostics, community health services, and a medical clinic within the same footprint. The long-term care residents are divided into two, 15-bed 'homes', each with a landscaped, secure garden area accessible via a screen porch.

Biggar Integrated Health Centre, Biggar, SK

A new 54-resident, long-term care facility to replace the existing Diamond Lodge. The LTC was an addition to an existing hospital. The facility is designed to create a "home" like feel, starting at the front porch of each household. Residents within each household can freely choose their daily routine as they move from living room, kitchen/dining and private activities throughout the day.

Exterior courtyards are accessible via resident's "back door", providing secluded and safe access to walking paths, where residents can sit with their loved ones surrounded by familiar prairie vegetation.

Rosetown Integrated Health Centre, Rosetown, SK

A new addition connected to the existing hospital, providing 54 long-term care residents. The long-term care residents are divided into five 10 or 11-resident household configurations each with their own activity space, screened porch and dining room. Three large secure exterior courtyards are located near each "home" to provide residents with private and safe access to the outdoors. Raised planters offer accessible gardening plots for residents' use.

Already a part of an aging-in-place campus, the major expansion of the Rest Haven Personal Care Home from 60 residents to 142 which is linked to Woodhaven Manor seniors housing (also designed by ft3 in two phases in the 1990s) supports community, family and friends in a safe, residential model. The nursing home institution is deconstructed with 12 new small houses working together in community. Each house has

its own living room, den, dining, kitchen and laundry with private bedrooms and ensuite bathrooms. Residents and community members come together in the common areas, that include outdoor patios and gardens, a sun-filled atrium, a large multipurpose gathering room, a chapel and café. A large family-sized home for 12 residents is ideally suited for preventing the spread of viruses while providing a comfortable social community.
